

Safety Advice: Please read before using the “Explore the Apache” VR Headset

Guide for use by children - According to the manufacturer, Oculus, the device is not to be used and is not suitable for children under the age of 13. This is to avoid damage to the child’s health if the device is used for prolonged periods of time. Here at the Army Flying Museum, we will only ever allow a child to use the device for 5 minutes and no longer. The product is not a toy, and the headset is not sized for children. Improper sizing can lead to discomfort or adverse health effects during prolonged use, and younger children are in a critical period in visual development.

It is your choice whether to allow your children to use the VR headset.

Interference with medical devices - The Oculus Quest Safety Guide warns that the headset and controller may contain magnets or components that emit radio waves, which could affect the operation of nearby electronics, including **cardiac pacemakers and hearing aids**. If you have a pacemaker or other implanted medical device, consult your doctor or the manufacturer of your medical device before using the headset or controllers. Maintain a safe distance between the headset and controller and your medical devices. Stop using the headset or controllers if you observe a persistent interference with your medical device.

Pre-existing medical conditions – The Oculus Quest Safety Guide advises you to consult with your doctor before using the headset if you are pregnant, elderly, have pre-existing binocular vision abnormalities or psychiatric disorders, or suffer from a heart condition or other serious medical condition.

Seizures – The Oculus Quest Safety Guide also states that if you previously have had a seizure, loss of awareness, or other symptom linked to an epileptic condition you should see a doctor before using the headset. Anyone who experiences any of these symptoms should stop using the headset and see a doctor.
