

Instructions



During and after the First World War vases were often made from shell cases and engraved with regimental badges. This is often called Trench Art. Find out more about trench art by visiting our Home Learning Pages on armyflying.com

You will need

- Template sheet
- Paper or card
- Glue
- Scissors
- Pencil ,pens

- Cut out and colour in the petals, stems, vase, butterfly and Royal Flying Corps Badge on the template page.
- You can use the paper shapes as they are or use them as templates to draw around so you can use different paper or card. Gold shiny card for example would be perfect for the shell case vase.
- Find an A4 piece of paper and card to create your picture on.
- Arrange and glue down the stems underneath the vase
- To create the flowers stick the larger tulip shape down first then glue the smaller one on top in the center. After that glue them to the tops of the stems.
- (You can also use the paper shapes as templates to add more flowers or draw some of your own..)
- Glue the vase over the top of the stems as in our picture.
- Glue the butterfly and bee on the picture wherever you like.
